

Delce Academy

Oversubscription criteria: 2018

If the number of requests received via the co-ordinated scheme is more than the number of places available, places will be allocated in the following priority order:

- ☐ Children in Public Care – as defined in the Medway co-ordinated admission scheme (looked after children and previously looked after children);
- ☐ Children attending Delce Infant School or St Peter's Infant School **N.B. this criteria applies to admissions to year 3 only;**
- ☐ Children who at the time of application have a brother or sister (including children living as siblings in the same family unit) on the roll of the school at the time of the sibling's admission;
- ☐ Child's health reasons, supported by medical evidence, which requires the child to attend this school;
- ☐ Children who at the time of application have a parent who is a member of staff at the school (where the member of staff has been employed for three years or more at the time at which the application for admission is made and/or where the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage)
- ☐ Nearness of child's home to school measured using Medway Council's criteria.

TIEBREAKER

In the event of a tie within any criterion above, e.g. if two or more children have the same priority in any criterion, places will be allocated to those living closest to the school measured by the shortest available walking route.
