Oversubscription criteria: 2018

Oversubscription Criteria – Year 7

Where applications for admission of eligible girls exceed this number, the following criteria will be applied in the order set out below, to decide which girls who satisfied the selection requirements should be offered places:

1. Looked After Children / Children in Local Authority Care - as defined in the Medway Co-ordinated Admissions Scheme.

2. Students with an agreed Educational Health Care Plan (EHCP) or Statement of Special Educational Needs that names Fort Pitt Grammar School as the appropriate school.

3. Siblings

The sibling of a student who will still be attending the school at the time the student would be admitted. In this context “sibling” means children who live in the same house, including natural, adopted, step and foster siblings.

4. Fort Pitt Thomas Aveling (FPTA) academies siblings

Students who attend a school or who have a sibling in a school within the FPTA Academies. In this context “sibling” means children who live as siblings in the same house, including natural, adopted, step and foster siblings.

5. Children of staff (where the member of staff has been employed for three years or more at the time at which the application for admission is made and/or where the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage).

6. Girls residing within 2 miles of the school measured the Medway Council Geographical Information System.

7. Girls residing in one of the named parishes below.

These places will be allocated according to nearness of home to school, using the shortest, safe walking distance, measured by the Medway Council Geographical Information System.

- Allhallows
- Cliffe and Cliffe Woods
- Cooling
- Cuxton
- Frindsbury Extra
- Halling
- High Halstow
- Hoo St Werburgh
- St James, Isle of Grain
- St Mary Hoo
- Stoke

Please note that the prospective student's address must be where they are living at the time of the application and this will be checked. If the address is not the student's normal place of residence and an offer of a place has already been made, it will be withdrawn.

8. All other eligible girls seeking a school place and these will be allocated according to nearness of home to school, using the shortest, safe walking distance, measured by the Medway Council Geographical Information System.

Tiebreaker

In the unlikely event that two or more children in all other ways have equal eligibility for the last available place at the school, the names will be issued a number and drawn randomly to decide which child should be given the place.
